GLOBAL CRISIS

In just over a week after COVID-19 was declared a global pandemic, United Way Greater Victoria (UWGV) launched the Local Love in a Global Crisis fund to help our most vulnerable and our critically important social service sector. The fund has galvanized donor support, government support – federal, provincial and municipal – and corporate sector support. To date, \$1.2 million has been raised to provide relief to our community. Collectively, here's how we took action to make a difference and responded during the first phase of the pandemic.

ACTION 1.

March 19 - In Greater Victoria, Local Love in a Global Crisis Fund launches focusing on non-profit sector support/basic needs, mental health and addictions, and help for seniors.

ACTION 2.

March 27 - BC Government partners with United Ways throughout the province in Safe Seniors, Strong Communities initiative to help isolated seniors. bc211 takes on coordination role. United Way partner Beacon Community Services manages local efforts.

ACTION 3.

March 29 - The Government of Canada announces \$9 million New Horizons for Seniors Program managed by United Way across the country. Over \$180 thousand allocated in Greater Victoria to 8 local seniors' organizations including a coordinated meal delivery program for isolated seniors.

ACTION 4.

March 30 - UWGV partners with Accent Inns to offer hotel rooms for frontline workers needing to recoup and to safely self-isolate.

ACTION 5.

April 4 & 25 - UWGV creates the Neighbourhood Response Team with local partner agencies. Two public collection drives result in 600 tents, tarps and sleeping bags safely collected for people experiencing homelessness, and 28,000 personal hygiene items collected for people in need.

ACTION 6.

April 7 - UWGV partners with City of Langford who donate \$20 thousand to offer accommodation options to Langford frontline workers.

ACTION 7.

April 21 - The Government of Canada announces \$350 million Emergency Community Support Fund to help community organizations across the country. Funds managed by Canadian Red Cross, Community Foundations of Canada and United Way. \$1.65 million made available to Greater Victoria community organizations.

ACTION 8.

April 30 - Scale Collaborative and Vancity partner with UWGV to launch Survive & Thrive fund to help non-profits scale up, shift business models or hibernate in response to COVID-19.

ACTION 9.

May 1 - The Bay Centre and Earl's Kitchen + Bar team up with UWGV to launch one for one match program - for every grocery kit purchased from Earl's, one is donated to a family in need.

ACTION 10.

May 11 - \$1.2 million invested from Local Love in a Global Crisis fund into 14 local social service agencies. Many of our funded partners are asking for support in pivoting to digital and distance service delivery.
