The project will reinvigorate the organizational and public identity of the Society that values openness and collaboration.
Broadmead Care Society	Beckley Farm Lodge Commercial Equipment Need	This grant supports the purchase of an industrial washing machine for Beckley Farm Lodge. BFL currently has one industrial washing machine and two industrial dryers, the additional machine will reduce occupational stressors and time management demands on Health Care Workers and Support Services Staff as well as ensure resident safety and comfort.
Capital Region Food and Agriculture Initiatives Roundtable (CRFAIR) c/o Community Food Hub Society	Equity First: Equity Centered Service Innovation and Program Redesign	This project assesses and redesigns CRFAIR's Collective Impact Program through an equity lens, focusing on leadership, training, and resources for equity-deserving groups. It evaluates pandemic response efforts, adapts the CI Program's leadership, partnership platform, and project management tools for a more inclusive initiative that works towards a healthy, just, and equitable food system for all.
Capital Region Prostate Centre	Expansion of Vancouver Island Prostate Health Nurse Navigator Role	Due to cuts in supportive care programming, prostate cancer patients have experienced a loss to programs and services that benefit them both at the time of diagnosis and into their recovery as well. This project helps fill the gaps by expanding the Nurse Navigator program into more remote communities on Vancouver Island.
Centre for Earth and Spirit Society	Finding Belonging: Strengthening Program Capacity/Reach for Seniors & Equity-Deserving Groups	This project grows and expands intergenerational circles, end-of-life support, meditation, forest therapy, decolonization, and an annual event celebrating Seniors. This project supports the Centre to "Take the Pulse" of Seniors' programming and client base to determine post-pandemic needs such as belonging, connection, and supportive needs.

Cetus Research & Conservation Society	Strengthening Safety Systems & Protocols For Consistent Marine Mammal Protection	This grant supports the modernization of Cetus' training and safety processes by hiring a coordinator who will create and oversee extensive new programs and protocols. Such development will foster adaptability and offer Cetus and our partners resiliency through responsive methodologies capable of functioning in the face of new and challenging circumstances.
Community Social Planning Council of Greater Victoria	CSPC ID Service Contact and Case Management Platform	The proposed CRM and Case Management Platform is a digital tool that will redesign delivery and management across services, particularly the Coordinated ID Service Program. This tool will increase capacity to serve clients and referral partners by automating the intake and management process, tracking referrals across partners and programs and providing data for monitoring and evaluation.

Topics can be customized for groups and individuals. Family Services of Greater Victoria Society	Newcomer wrap around mental health and support services	This program will provide a range of inclusive, professional therapeutic programs and services to immigrants and refugees to support their transition to a new life in Canada. The project will enable FSGV to build their staffing capacity to meet the increasing demand of those in the newcomer population with multiple barriers and to offer essential mental health services free of charge.

Friends of Living and Learning Through Loss Society (LTL)	Youth Loss and Grief Program	This project supports LTL in completing a comprehensive update of its programming to meet the current and complex loss and grief supports youth need. Recently completed technical infrastructure will allow LTL to deliver interactive, multi-media programming that meets the needs of diverse audiences and creates a sustained long-term impact through its self-serve, 24/7/365 accessibility and community building aspects.

The project will strengthen, adapt and expand the Pacific Animal Therapy Society's (PATS) volunteer intake process, implement process and system improvements, and promote connections within our pet therapy communities. Stronger connections with PATS volunteers, community supporters, and other pet therapy organizations will make the organization more modern, resilient, relevant and adaptable.
Peers Victoria Resources Society	Digitizing Training, Education, and Human Resource Materials for Peer Led Work	This project will support digitizing a wide variety of education curriculum.
